Private Sector Engagement

- June 2012: PPP Workshop on Water & Sanitation will take place in Dakar, Senegal jointly organized by IFC, ICA, WSP, PPIAF
- 2nd half 2012: Compile recommendations and publish Knowledge Piece

Cross Border / Benefit Sharing

- March/April 2012: Finalize ToRs based on results of GIZ Pre-Study and procurement of Consultant for "Compendium of best practices in cross border investments & benefit sharing (case studies)"
- August 2012: Disseminate first results at water conferences (e.g. WWW)
- 3rd Quarter: Publish final study
